

Main Street Water Main Replacement Dighton Water District Public Water System ID # 4076000 Dighton, Massachusetts DWSRF # 6863

The Dighton Water District is replacing approximately 12,500 linear feet of 12-inch to 6-inch water main on Main Street, Williams Street to County Street. Woodard & Curran, the Town's engineering consultant, designed the distribution main which includes two culvert crossings and all the associated service connections, valves, and hydrants.

C. Naughton Corporation was awarded construction contract on June 30,2022. Final completion of the Main Street water main is anticipated by September 13, 2023.

The project cost is \$2,905,224.50. The project is fully financed by Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF).

The Massachusetts DWSRF Program is a federal-state partnership that provides low-cost financing to help community public water suppliers. The Massachusetts DWSRF Program is jointly administered through the Massachusetts Clean Water Trust by the Commissioner of the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection, the State Treasurer, and the Secretary of Energy and Environmental Affairs pursuant to M.G.L.c. 29C, § 2.

DWSRF programs operate around the country to provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our valuable water resources nationwide.
